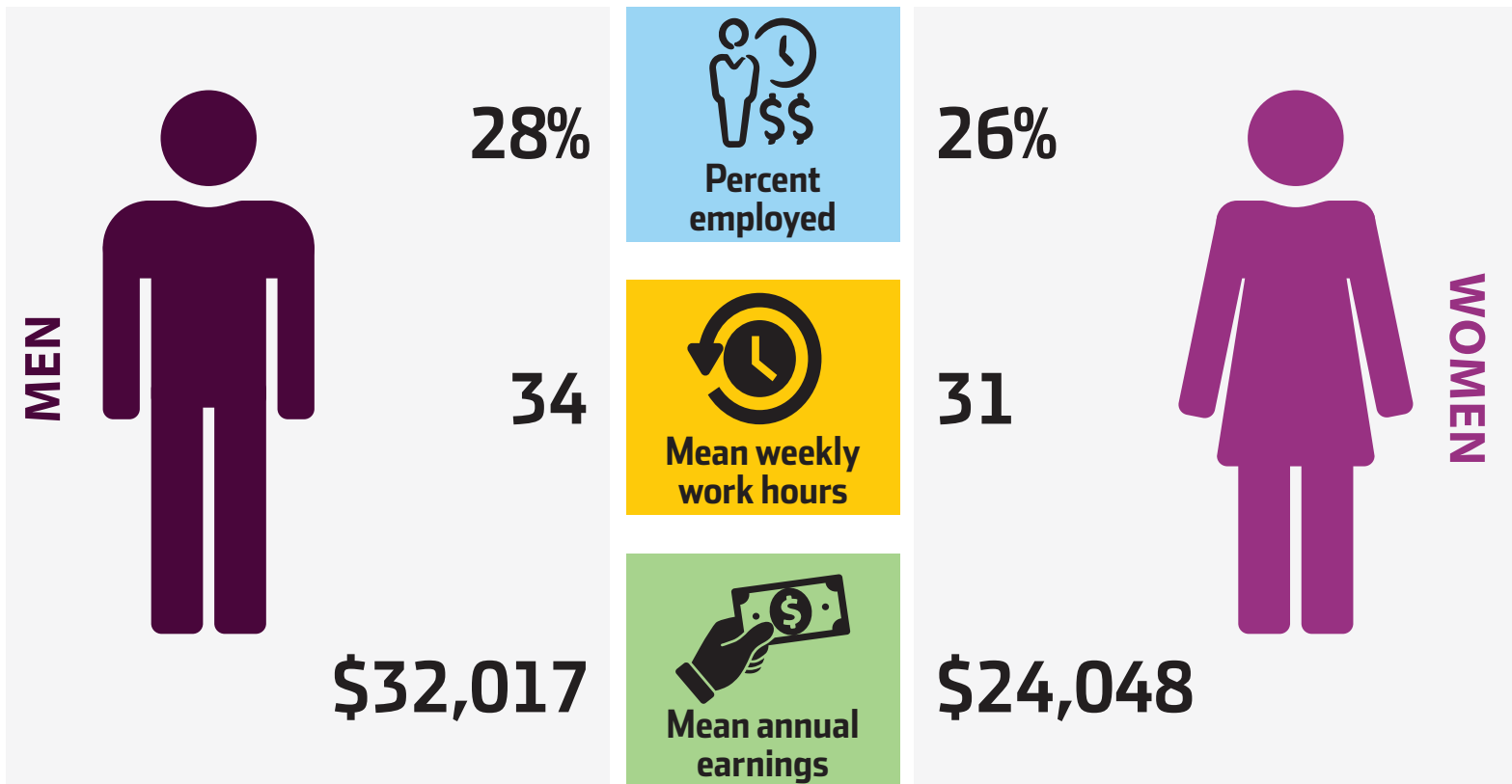


Gender Disparities in Workforce Participation

Despite being employed at similar rates and working similar hours, women with a cognitive disability earn 28.4% less than men with a cognitive disability.
